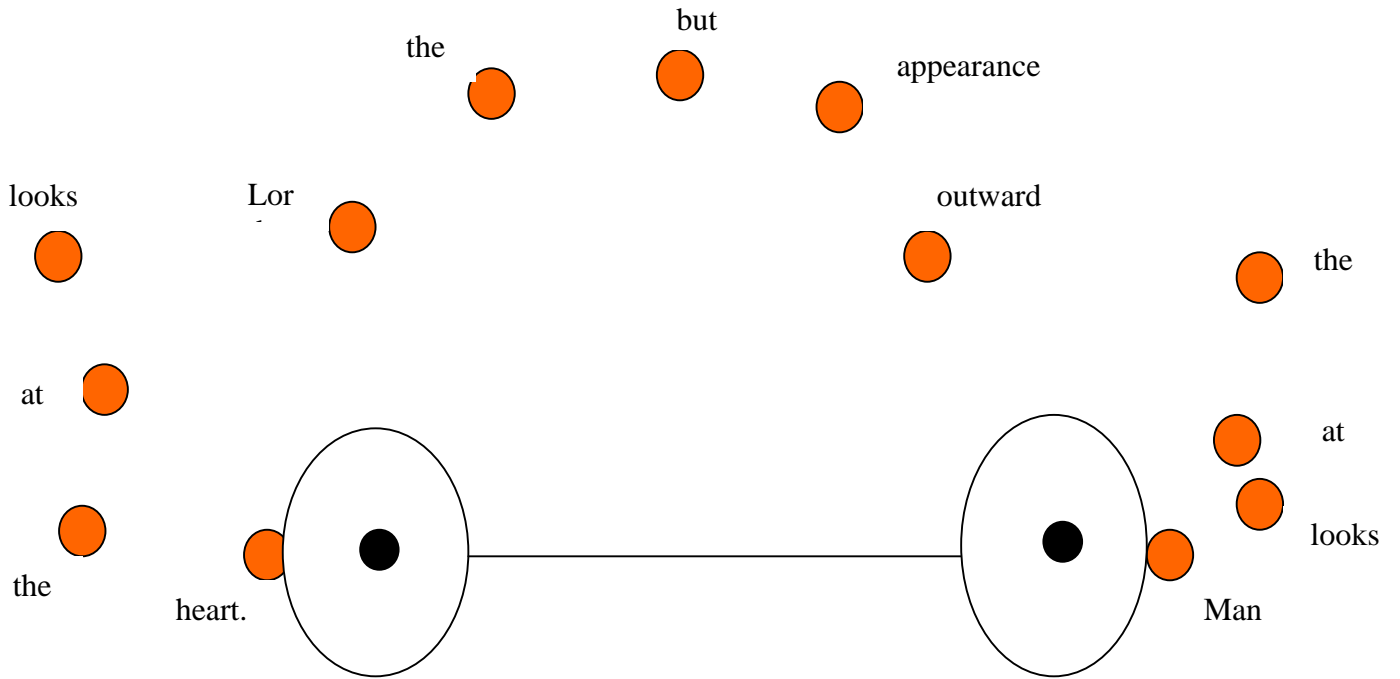

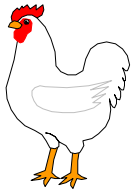
Rebus Verse (1)

A rebus is a tricky little puzzle that uses pictures to represent syllables, words, or even sounds. For instance: **gr** + **8**, could mean *great* or *grate*; **8** + a picture of a mouse and a person with a speech bubble saying “eee” could mean *80* (eight eee); a picture of a **wasp** and a **1-ton weight** could mean *beaten* (bee ton), etc. Sometimes letters are added to or subtracted from the spelling of a word that is pictured to make a new word. For instance a picture of an eel with a +h would mean “heal” or “heel”. Sometimes sounds and letters are put together in a way that even though they do not necessarily sound like a new word, if said quickly they almost form the new word that the puzzle is trying to get you to use. For instance: **fl** + “**a picture of a head**” could mean fled (fl “head”).

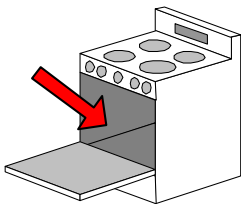
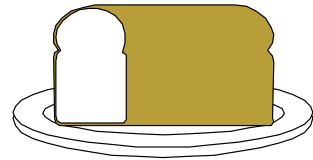
